# **INDIGENOUS HEALING & RECONCILATION**

**COLLECTION.** There will be a special collection *next* weekend to support the Indigenous Healing and Reconciliation Fund. The fund will support both local and national programs proposed by Indigenous communities to nurture the ongoing reconciliation journey. To date, the fund has raised close to 40 per cent of the \$30 million target as pledged by the Canadian bishops. The archdiocese will contribute \$6 million towards the national pledge. Yellow envelopes are available at the back of the Church for this purpose.

**STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY:** Archbishop Leo has prepared a homily for this weekend's Stewardship Sunday. It is available on our parish as well as diocesan website: <u>www.archtoronto.org/stewardship</u>, both in English and Polish, as well as other languages.

**109<sup>th</sup> WORD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES (SEPTEMBER 24).** The theme for this year's World Day of Migrants and Refugees is "*Free* to Choose Whether to Migrate or to Stay." While the decision to migrate should always be free, in many cases it is not. St. John Paul II wrote, "building conditions of peace means in practice being seriously committed to safeguarding first of all the right not to emigrate, that is, the right to live in peace and dignity in one's own country." We recall the words of Our Lord when He said "...I was a stranger, and you welcomed me", which remind us to see in the migrant not simply a brother or sister in difficulty, but Christ himself, who knocks at our door.

**REJOICING IN OUR NEIGHBOUR'S GIFTS.** In the first reading from the book of the Prophet Isaiah we are reminded that God doesn't think the same way we do. "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." Not only are God's ways different than ours, they are higher and better. We see this in the Gospel where the landowner in the parable gives an equal wage to the labourers regardless of how long they worked for.

The labourers who worked the longest felt that they did not receive what was just. As stewards, we too can sometimes fall into the temptation of feeling that the gifts God has given us is not to the level we would have liked. Similarly, we may sometimes feel that other people should not have the gifts that they have received. In doing this, we are subtly wanting God to think in the same way we do.

Instead, we should strive to be stewards that are grateful for the gifts we have received. Moreover, we should even be grateful and praise God for the gifts of others. As we are all one Body of Christ, when one member has particular gifts, we all as a Church should celebrate and boast of that gift. St. Paul says in his letter to the Corinthians that within the Body of Christ, "if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it." Let us take some time today to thank God for His many gifts in our lives and the lives of our fellow parishioners. (source: archtoronto.org/stewardship)

Also please remember that the offering for the candles is \$5 for each large candle and \$1 for each small one. *Thank you!*

The deadline for returning the registration forms is Sunday, October 29.

Ten cel wydaje mi się czasem nagrodą za zasługi. Za dobre życie, za wierność Panu Jezusowi. Bardzo się staram, ale wciąż jest lęk: Czy wystarczająco? Tymczasem Pan Bóg mówi o sobie: "Bo myśli moje nie są myślami waszymi ani wasze drogi moimi drogami" (I czytanie). On nie jest jak wychowawca z mojej szkoły, na którego życzliwość musiałem zasłużyć.
